10th Encountered two small Leverets on his fields.

29th Two Wrens in his Greenhouse that were probably hunting for insects round his tomato plants. On a general note he thinks that there are a very high number of rabbits which may explain why the Buzzard is being seen quite regularly. Unfortunately it may also trigger the next myxomatosis outbreak
