Neighbourhood Watch – Peter Bloom

There is a new “Safer Neighbourhoods” poster on the Village Noticeboard with useful suggestions on how to make your property more thief proof.

1 On the evening of Wednesday 24th October a vehicle was seen on Burdale Close/Hambleton Road area, Norton, acting suspiciously. The vehicle was stopped by police a short time later and was found to contain items of property which are suspected to be from a burglary. Three males from the South Yorkshire area were arrested by North Yorkshire Police. A short time later a burglary was reported at a premises on Burdale Close, Norton. However at this time the items of property recovered from the vehicle by the police remain unidentified. If anyone saw anything suspicious or have any information, particularly around the time 1800-1900 hours, please contact the police on 101 quoting 12130184251. Police are concerned that the items may be from a burglary which has not yet been reported. If anyone has been the victim of burglary which has not been reported as yet please do so immediately. Could people also consider any properties where people may be away from home or on holiday. If anyone has found any items of property which may have been discarded in their garden, street or local area please contact the police.

2 North Yorkshire Neighbourhood Watch Association A Destructive malware "CryptoLocker" is on the loose Demanding money with menaces. Please be vigilant to this scam. Malware that encrypts your data and tries to sell it back to you **CryptoLocker**, detected by Sophos as **Troj/Ransom-ACP**, is a malicious program known as ransomware. Some ransomware just freezes your computer and asks you to pay a fee. (These threats can usually be unlocked without paying up, using a decent anti-virus program as a recovery tool.) **CryptoLocker** is different: your computer and software keep on working, but your personal files, such as documents, spreadsheets and

images, are encrypted. The criminals retain the only copy of the decryption key on their server - it is not saved on your computer, so you cannot unlock your files without their assistance, for a **substantial fee**.
