Neighbourhood Watch and Rural Watch How you can help the police and yourself. Your information could help stop a criminal in their tracks, if you see any suspicious people or vehicles in your area, please contact the police.

To report a crime or incident, or provide information; phone the non-emergency number 101 When you go out - leave a light on to give the impression there is someone at home. 58% of burglaries take place in the evening or night and 34% occur at the weekend. Timer switches can be fitted to operate radios and lights when you are out. Be smart about how you position them - a bedroom light coming on at 9.30pm and going off at 11.00pm is sensible. Protect your property - be on your guard against 2-in-1 burglaries where thieves break into a house, take the car keys then steal the homeowner's car. Police see an increase in this type of crime in the autumn and winter months and there is an operation to nip them in the bud.

Ringmaster 2 Between 1345hrs and 1420hrs on Monday 4th November 2013, a suspicious incident occurred on the outskirts of Swinton near Malton. A lone young female was walking her dog along Low Lane away from the village towards the river. The female realised she was being followed by a male who was walking a short distance behind her. The male slowed as she slowed, stopped as she stopped and sped up as she sped up. The male is described as white, 40 to 50 years old, about 5'9" tall and of broad build. He possibly had dark hair but had no facial hair and he was not wearing glasses. He wore a dark zip up fleece and dark coloured, possibly tracksuit bottoms. Anyone with information as to the identity of the male or who has found themselves in similar circumstances to this young female in the Swinton area is asked to contact PC Paul Fenwick at Malton Police Station by calling 101 quoting police incident number 12130193110

Ringmaster 3 Information is sought after a burglary occurred at Loft Antiques, 43 Market Place, Pickering, on Wednesday 13th November at approximately 6pm. Please ring the police on Tel 101 quoting reference number 12130197362 if you saw any suspicious persons or vehicles.

Ringmaster 4 Theft of old farm machinery including Cambridge rollers, an old plough and rotavator has taken place from the old railway line near the Marishes during the past week. If you have been in the area and noticed anything suspicious please ring 101 quoting reference number 12130197508

Ringmaster 5 Please find below the description of items stolen from a premises on Farmanby Close in Thornton Dale near Pickering between 26th-27th October 2013 . DC 463 Lucie Welford is leading the investigation and is trying to ascertain if anyone has been offered these items for sale or bought them. It is possible that the burglars are from out of force possibly West Yorkshire. Description of the stolen property is as follows:

1. A Robert Thompson 'Mouseman' Solid Oak Tea Tray 'kidney' shape which was 1'6" wide and 1'1" in diameter with two mice, one on each edge.
2. A bone/ivory carving of a crocodile with three or four elephants decreasing in size on a black plinth - this is believed to depict the story of The Elephant's Child by Rudyard Kipling.
