Neighbourhood Watch

1 Operation Hawk is our campaign to tackle rural and cross-border crime, and is already showing results: there were 5,709 incidents of rural crime in North Yorkshire in 2014, down from 6,341 in 2013. A spokesman for North Yorkshire Police said: "Criminals coming to North Yorkshire are finding that it is very difficult to get in and out again without us catching them or knowing they have been here. Travelling criminals and local law-breakers should take note, the tough stance shown during yesterday's Operation Hawk day of action will continue. North Yorkshire is one of the safest places in the country and we are determined to keep it that way."

2 Between 1430hrs and 1530hrs today 26th February the occupants of a black Ford Focus Reg No EY03TUH were responsible for the theft of alcohol from 2 premises in Pickering and Kirkbymoorside. BUT... Three men were arrested on the M1 near Garforth after the reports of the two shop thefts. Officers seized 83 bottles of spirits with a value of about £1,500, as well as boxes of medication and a quantity of meat.

Overnight on Friday 13th February 2015, several vans were broken into and power-tools stolen in the Cattle Market in Malton (crime ref 12150024854), Wood Street in Norton (crime ref 12150024881) and Town Street in Old Malton (12150025200 and 12150024877).

3 A Scarborough man has been jailed for four years for committing sexual offences against a teenage girl.
Gareth Hudson, 36, of Stepney Road, Scarborough, targeted his victim, who was 14 at the time, via the internet. He encouraged her to send him indecent images of herself, and also contacted her on Skype, performed a sexual act, and asked her to engage in sexual activity. Hudson pleaded guilty to two counts of inciting a girl to engage in sexual activity, and one count of engaging in sexual activity in the presence of a child. He was jailed for four years at York Crown Court on Friday 20 February. Detective Sergeant Jonathan Sygrove, of Scarborough CID, said: "Hudson harassed his victim for his own sexual gratification. He now has a number of years in prison to reflect on his disgusting behaviour."

Anyone who is affected by sexual abuse, whether it is happening now, or occurred many years ago, should not hesitate to come forward to the police or contact one of the many agencies who can help.

4 Quad bike owners are being urged to take extra steps to protect their vehicles, after a number of thefts in the Selby area in recent months. Three quad bikes have been stolen from rural parts of Selby district in the last four months, in Camblesforth, Church Fenton and Escrick. Quad bikes have also been taken from rural areas elsewhere in the county, including Kirkbymoorside and Whitby, over the same period. Now the local Safer Neighbourhood Team is calling on quad bike owners to ensure that they do everything possible to make life hard for rural criminals. Sergeant Chris Jones, of Selby Police, said: "North Yorkshire is a very safe place, but unfortunately quad bikes, plant and other farm machinery are attractive targets for travelling criminals. While I don't want rural residents to be unnecessarily concerned, I do want them to take basic crime prevention measures to keep their valuable property safe."
