### **Neighbourhood Watch**

1 Police are urgently appealing for assistance in locating a convicted murderer who is wanted for emergency recall to prison, after he breached his release licence. William Kerr, 53, needs to be arrested and returned to prison as a matter of urgency. If seen, people are asked not to approach him but instead to call the police immediately on 999. Kerr was jailed for life for murder at Leeds Crown Court on 26 June 1998, and released on licence on 23 January 2015. The National Offender Management Service contacted North Yorkshire Police for assistance after Kerr absconded from approved premises in Hull. His current whereabouts are not known, however he is known to have links to the Humberside, West Yorkshire and London areas. Officers are currently conducting extensive enquiries to locate him as a matter of urgency. Two photographs of Kerr have been circulated to the press and published on social media. If you would prefer to remain anonymous, please contact Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111, quoting North Yorkshire Police reference number 12150049525 and say it is "urgent".

2 Police in North Yorkshire are warning people not to be taken in by conmen making phone calls about bank fraud and claiming to be police officers. The warning comes after a member of the public from Ripon took a call from a man claiming to be a detective who was investigating a fraud on their bank account and asked for bank account details including Personal Identification Numbers (PIN). He asked them to call back on the police non-emergency number 101, to verify his identity. The victim's phone call to 101 then appeared to be re-routed back to the suspects who held their line open. Thankfully, in this instance, the intended victims did the right thing and did not give any bank details over the phone. They became suspicious of the caller and reported the incident to the police. 3 Police are urging members of the public not to interfere with wildlife traps in rural areas, after a

number of legal traps were damaged on the North York Moors. PC Andy Marsden, a Wildlife Crime Officer at North Yorkshire Police, said: "It is important that legal traps are not interfered with, as they play a part in reducing the predation of eggs and chicks of ground nesting birds such as lapwings, curlews and grouse. If you discover one of these traps and you are not certain of its use, please do not take it upon yourself to interfere with it. If you have concerns, photograph the trap in situ, get a GPS location if possible, and contact North Yorkshire Police so we can investigate. We take such reports very seriously, and will take decisive action against people who commit wildlife crime."

4 A barn full of straw was set alight last night causing thousands of pounds worth of damage. This was in an isolated rural location near Sand Hutton and Claxton. Please be vigilant and report to police immediately if people are seen on land or acting suspiciously. Incident number 12150045291 refers if you have any information about last night's arson.

5 If anyone saw an item of property described as small handbag size, being discarded from a vehicle on the morning of Wednesday 18th March on the A170 in the Wrelton area, please get in touch with the police on telephone number 101 quoting reference 12150044120

6 Crane slings were stolen overnight from a crane lorry parked at Gate Helmsley. Please ring 101 ref 12150043507 with any information.

7 An Ifor Williams Trailer with cage sides in galvanised silver has been stolen from a locked outbuilding at Villa Farm, Norton, Malton between 1130 hrs on 14 March and 1145 hrs on 17 March. Please ring 101 quoting 12150043499

8 Trading Standards have received several reports from across the North Yorkshire area of residents being "cold called" by fish traders. Reports have been received today from the Harrogate and Ryedale areas. The usual reports received by Trading Standards involve consumers being pressurised into buying large quantities of fish they do not want or need.
