Nature Notes

A cuckoo was heard in the Zoo on Thurs 18^{th} June and again at the top of the Village near the Village Hall on Sat 20^{th} June.

Alec Ward reports 11th he watched a crow turning his bird feeder repeatedly on its side to steal the peanuts.

12th a weasel hunting young rabbits along a barley field edge. 20th Saw a covey of 8-9 young Grey Partridge chicks. 28th New clutch of Mallard ducklings on his pond. 29th a Greater Spotted Woodpecker flew into the glass of a window of his bungalow. It recovered and flew off.

Finally he reports two dogs, one a Black Labrador the other a beagle like terrier running wild by his Low Moor Farm. This is the third time he has seen them and they ran off toward Ryton. If anyone knows of these dogs can they please inform the owner that there is a problem!

Neighbourhood Watch

1 Overnight on Monday 29 June lead has been stolen from the roofs of houses on Burgate and Willowgate in Pickering. Please be vigilant and report any suspicious persons or vehicles including registration numbers immediately via 101 or 999. 2 Police are appealing for information after a unique stone artefact was stolen from a church in Hovingham, near Malton. Sometime between 23 May and 6 June 2015, offenders entered All Saints Church in Hovingham and stole a carved stone which was on display in the recess of a window. The statue, originally part of a stone cross, dates from the late eighth or early ninth century, and is likely to be contemporary with the shrine panel still preserved in the church. It is particularly notable for its ornate and accomplished carving. The stone itself is a sandstone from the quarries at Aislaby near Whitby, demonstrating the links between the Anglo-Saxon church at Hovingham and Whitby Abbey, which owned the quarries and exported stone for sculptural monuments to sites across North and East Yorkshire. The piece measures 51 cm high, 23.2cm at its widest, and 12.8cm at its deepest. It is very heavy and will have required a vehicle to remove it.

3 North Yorkshire Trading Standards have received two reports in the last 24 hours of elderly residents being

called from a company calling themselves the Claims Advisory Group advising the resident they had been overcharged by their bank by several thousand pounds. In order to obtain the refund they must obtain £200 of UKash vouchers which the company will collect prior to releasing the funds into the resident's bank account. Needless to say this is a scam. 5 The crack down on drink and drug driving continues with North Yorkshire Police planning a number of targeted operations over the coming weeks. 540 breath tests have been conducted with 61 arrests having been made so far. Of particular concern from the arrests already made are the high levels of alcohol being detected. Alarmingly 20% of those arrests have provided samples three times over the legal limit (35 micrograms per 100ml). During the same campaign last year only 6% of arrests provided readings of this level.

The highest reading taken so far was from a 58-year-old man arrested in the Malton area, who blew 139ug – just under four times the legal limit. He was later charged to Scarborough Magistrates' Court and received a driving ban for 34 months and was ordered to pay £295 costs and carry out 300 hours of unpaid work. A 42-year-old man who appeared at York Magistrates' Court with a reading of 123ug/100ml received a 12 week suspended prison sentence, along with a 36 month ban and £315 costs to pay. Four further cases have appeared in court this week; all received driving bans and hefty fines. New road side drug screening devices are also helping North Yorkshire Police catch those driving under the influence of drugs. 13 arrests have been made so far due to positive drugs tests with three positive results for cannabis.

Sgt Andy Morton of the Roads Policing Group said "These prosecutions show that if people choose to break the law and drive under the influence of drink or drugs - we are out in force and waiting to catch you. Be assured, when we do, you will face a hefty fine and the possibility of a prison sentence. If you are going out to have a drink ensure you have thought about how you will get home at the end of the night - leave your car at home. We continue to appeal to members of the public that if they know of someone driving under the influence of drink or drugs – please contact North Yorkshire Police on 101 or report it anonymously to Crimestoppers on 0800 555111.
